Dr. Florence Myrick is CASN's inaugural Pat Griffin Annual Nursing Education Research Scholar. Dr. Myrick is the Associate Dean at the University of Alberta and, throughout her career, has been involved in numerous research projects with a primary focus on preceptorship. Dr. Myrick's service to the academic community is distinguished; she was a member of the Editorial Board for the International Journal of Nursing Education Scholarship, and she is currently a member of the Editorial Board for *Nurse Education Today* and a reviewer for the *Canadian Journal of Nursing Leadership*, *Nursing Philosophy*, and for the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada. In light of her distinguished career, Dr. Myrick has been the recipient of various awards for her professional activities, such as the CASN Award for Excellence in Education, the CARNA Award for Excellence in Education, and the ANEA Award for Leadership in Nursing Education.

Dr. Sonia Acorn is a Professor Emerita, the University of British Columbia and currently teaches at Athabasca University, Centre for Nursing and Health Studies. During her academic career Dr. Acorn's teaching and research focused on leadership issues and assisting families living with chronic conditions, and she has published widely on these topics; her most recent publication, co-authored with Margaret Osborne, is entitled *Scholarship in Nursing: Current View*, and will appear in the *Canadian Journal of Nursing Leadership*. In addition to this, Dr. Acorn is an experienced CASN on-site accreditation reviewer and has served as a member of the CASN Task Force on Accreditation. During her career Dr. Acorn has been the recipient of several awards including the *CASN Wendy McBride Excellence Award for Accreditation Reviewer*, the *Registered Nurses Association of British Columbia (College of Registered Nurses of BC) Award of Excellence in Nursing Research*, and the *BC Scholars to China Award*.

Dr. Cynthia Baker is the Executive Director of the Canadian Association of Schools of Nursing. She is responsible for overseeing the Accreditation Program, and has contributed to it in many ways, including as a reviewer in the past. Dr. Baker has a long history and experience in the area of Scholarship as an active researcher, educator, and as a former Director at two Schools of Nursing. In her roles as Director of both Queen's University School of Nursing, and Université de Moncton's École de sciences infirmière, she has had experience in developing programs of Scholarship at the undergraduate, graduate and post-graduate levels.
