Post-RN: 9 schools did not report admission data; 7 schools did not report enrolment data

Master's: 1 school did not report admission data

Doctoral: 1 school did not report admission data; 1 school did not report enrolment data

NP: 3 schools did not report admission data; 2 schools did not report enrolment data

2002: The 2003-2004 survey was sent to 134 schools offering nursing programs; 101 schools completed the survey; 29

CEGEPs and 4 Que. universities did not complete the survey.

Of the 101 schools who completed the 2002-2003 survey the following summarizes omitted or incomplete data by program:

Diploma: 1 school did not report admission, enrolment or graduate data

Baccalaureate: 1 university did not report admission data.

Post-RN: 4 universities included admission, enrolment and graduate data as part of baccalaureate data.

5 universities did not report enrolment data; 2 universities did not report graduate data.

Master's: 2 universities did not report admission or graduate data; 4 universities did not report enrolment data.

Doctoral: 2 universities did not report admission data.

NP: 1 university did not report admission data; 5 universities did not report enrolment data; 2 universities did

not report graduate data.

2001: 15 CEGEPs and 1 Que. university did not respond to the survey. Of the responding schools, 18 schools did not

report admission data; 19 schools did not report enrolment data and 17 schools did not report graduate data.

2000: 16 schools did not respond to the survey.

Of the responding schools, 1 school did not report admission data; 4 schools did not report enrolment or graduate

data.

3. Colleges and universities may establish program delivery partnerships which cross provincial/territorial boundaries. Where these partnerships exist, data are treated as follows: admission and enrolment data are recorded according to the program delivery responsibility of each partner. Graduates are captured in the graduate data of the university partner because the university awards the program degree. Please consult the Survey Methodology document for additional details.

Data for four out-of-province/territory baccalaureate collaborative partnerships are included in the table above. These partnerships are Aurora College, N.W.T., partnered with the University of Victoria, B.C.; College Universitaire Saint-Boniface, M.B., partnered with University of Ottawa / Université d'Ottawa. Ont.; Nunavut Arctic College, Nunavut, partnered with Dalhousie University, N.S.; and Humber College, Ont., partnered with the University of New Brunswick, N.B.

N.B.: The first cohort of baccalaureate students from Aurora College transferred to the University of Victoria in the academic year 2004-2005. The first cohort of baccalaureate graduates from the Nunavut Arctic College/Dalhousie University collaborative baccalaureate program graduated in 2004. The first cohort of baccalaureate graduates from the Humber College/University of New Brunswick collaborative baccalaureate program will graduate in 2005.

4. NP programs may be combined (i.e., integrated) with baccalaureate, post-RN or master's degree programs, and schools may report separate data for these integrated programs. In these instances, data are recorded under the NP program and the corresponding degree program. As a result, baccalaureate, post-RN and master's degree programs contain admission, enrolment and graduate data that are counted in both the degree program and the NP program. Such double count totals are minimal. For example, 29 of a total of 27,597 baccalaureate students are counted in the enrolment of baccalaureate and again in the enrolment of NP programs. General Notes

Data on NP programs not collected before 2001.

Previous to 1998, collection was for academic year. The 1998 to 2000 collection was for calendar year. As of 2001, collection returned to academic year (Sep. 1 to Aug. 31) for enrolment but remains at calendar year for graduation.

Definitions

Admission: The number of first-time students admitted to Year 1; calculated after allowed withdrawal date.

Enrolment: The number of students enrolled in each year of the program.

Graduate: The number of students who successfully graduated from the program.
