General Notes

Different collection periods, methodologies and under reporting from a small percentage of schools, may result in differences between the records of your province/territory and the National Student and Faculty data. **Please consult the Student and Faculty Survey Methodology document.**

2004: The 2004-2005 survey was sent to 134 schools offering nursing programs; 120 schools completed the survey; 13 QC CEGEPs (13 diploma programs), and 1 Ont. college (1 baccalaureate program) did not complete the survey. See Report 1 for the number of programs reported. Of the 120 schools who did complete the survey, 1 school did not submit data regarding faculty members' highest level of education.

2003: The 2003-2004 survey was sent to 134 schools offering nursing programs; 117 schools completed the survey; 15 CEGEPs, 1 Ont. college and 1 Que. university did not complete the survey. Of the 117 schools who did complete the survey, 7 schools did not submit data regarding faculty members' highest level of education.

2002: The 2002-2003 survey was sent to 134^r schools offering nursing programs; 29 CEGEPs and 4 Que. universities did not respond to the survey; of the 101^r schools who did respond to the survey, 4 schools did not submit data regarding faculty members' highest level of education.

2001: 15 CEGEPs and 1 Que. university did not respond to the survey.

2000: 16 schools did not respond to the survey.

1999: 20 schools did not respond to the survey.

Previous to 1998, collection was for academic year. The 1998 to 2000 collection was for calendar year. As of 2001, collection returned to academic year (Sep. 1 to Aug. 31) for enrolment, but remains at calendar year for graduation.
