The successful incumbent will also be expected to contribute to service activities within the School, the Faculty of Health, the University, and the wider community.

The successful candidate is expected to lead an innovative and collaborative program of research that engages the community in the area of mental health and addictions. This position complements faculty renewal and brings together interprofessional teams to support the School and Faculty research strategy to develop a collaborative, supportive and efficient research infrastructure.
