

TEACHING TERM APPOINTMENTS SATELITE SITES FACULTY OF NURSING

MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY OF NEWFOUNDLAND

(4-8-Month Teaching Term Appointments)

Memorial University Faculty of Nursing (MUNFON) is located on the university campus and offers programs leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (four-year and accelerated options), a Master of Science in Nursing (practicum and nurse practitioner options), a Post Master's Nurse Practitioner Graduate Diploma, and a PhD in Nursing. The undergraduate program is also offered in three satellite sites located at Gander, Grand Falls-Windsor, and Happy Valley-Goose Bay.

The Faculty of Nursing has four and eight-month teaching term appointments for the 2025-2026 academic year for clinical teaching in all clinical areas at each of the three satellite sites. While these appointments are for clinical teaching, the incumbent may also teach a course(s) in a classroom or lab setting.

The minimum qualifications for teaching term appointments at the undergraduate level are a completed bachelor's degree in nursing, and a master's degree, with preference given to applicants with a Master of Nursing or a Master of Science (Nursing) degree. Candidates who are near completion of a master's degree may also be considered. A minimum two years of nursing experience within the past three years in the clinical area of practice is required for clinical teaching in the undergraduate program.

Please note that successful applicants must hold a current practicing license with the College of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador (CRNNL) for the duration of the contract period, provide a criminal records screening and vulnerable sector check, and an up-to-date immunization record.

A complete application is comprised of the following: (a) a letter of introduction outlining relevant clinical and teaching experience; (b) a current curriculum vitae; and (d) the names and contact information (including email address) of three references, one of which is the applicant's current supervisor.

All positions are subject to budgetary approval and sufficient student enrolment.
